What is Sharing Our Spaces?

This is a newer community initiative that supports The Common Table at Church of the Redeemer. The auction invites interested vacationers to rent a cottage, which have been graciously offered by our Redeemer community. All of the proceeds collected for 'rent' go to The Common Table! It's a win-win... you get a restful vacation, and the rent cost you pay for that vacation goes to The Common Table!

Why should I support The Common Table at Church of the Redeemer?

Church of the Redeemer has invested in local outreach for many years. Today, The Common Table is a thriving community, operating 5 days a week, 4 hours a day. Our community serves those that are homeless, street-involved, living with poverty, or socially isolated. We serve 2 hot meals per day, offer services like nursing and counseling, and have many activities for our community to get involved in (including but not limited to – Art Studio, book club, music and guitar groups, reflection groups, workshops and seminars, community kitchen cooking classes, and much more).

The program is not government funded, we depend on the local community to make it all happen. Church of the Redeemer is by far the main funder of the program, along with some small local grants and foundations. By renting your vacation rental from our cottage mini-auction, you are supporting our program in a very direct way!

This year, the funds raised from this project will not only benefit the outreach work in the drop-in, but will also help us launch our outreach expansion project in the local neighbourhood. This is a project that we hope to get off the ground in 2019-2020, that will allow us to take a step towards 'doing outreach beyond our doors'. We will focus on 2-3 square blocks around the church for our outreach area, and train invested parishioners and neighbours in compassionate and effective street outreach through an integrative training approach.

How are bids taken for the mini-auction?

The Cottage Mini-Auction will run as a silent auction.

Bids will be taken through TWO different avenues:

 Email bids can be submitted between May 12th and May 25th to: hockinga@theredeemer.ca

Email bids must include the following:

- Bidder's first and last name
- Cottage title being bid on
- Dates being bid on for that cottage
- Bid amount
- Bidder's contact information (email and phone)

 In-Person bids can be made at church on Sundays on the dates of: Sunday, May 12th and Sunday, May 19th.

Note: Bidders can write their bids on the forms provided on the cottage auction table. Minimum bids noted for each cottage are minimums for the entire rental period. If a bidder really wants to win, the bidder can give Angie a confidential 'cap' on the bid, which can go up by \$50 increments if the bidder is unable to watch the auction closely. Please speak with Angie for more details.

What is the timeframe for the silent auction?

The auction will begin Sunday, May 12th and close Saturday, May 25th.

What if I have an emergency and I have to change my dates?

Life happens, and you might be planning this vacation 6 months in advance. Changes may be possible, but we cannot guarantee anything. Each winning bidder will be connected to the cottage owner, and with that person, you can decide if there is flexibility or not. Winning bidders will be connected to the cottage owner after the auction winners have been notified of the auction results (after May 15th).

Is my purchase of the cottage tax deductible?

Your purchase is not tax deductible. This is because – according to tax laws – the donor cannot 'receive goods' from their donation for it to be deductible.

What if I have more specific questions about the property?

We did our best to answer most of the questions about each property that we anticipated. However, if there is something pressing that you need to know about a specific property before placing your bid, please email me at hockinga@theredeemer.ca and your question will be sent to the cottage owner.

When do I know if I won the bid?

Winning bidders will be notified by Wednesday, May 29th at the latest.

If I win the bid, how and when do I pay?

By winning the bid, you are agreeing to pay the amount you stated in your email or on the silent bid sheet. Bid money can be paid by cheque to **Church of the Redeemer, memo 'The Common Table - Cottage Fundraiser'**. We ask that winning bidders pay for their cottage by June 15th, 2019 unless otherwise arranged.

Location: Just north of Bobcaygeon in the Kawarthas - 2.5 hour drive from Toronto

Description: This is a cottage comfortable and relaxed. With large screened-in porch, decks around the cottage and by the lake. Living space with wood stove and open kitchen. Outdoor shower. Lots of board games and art supplies.

Description: Solklint is located on one of the 30,000 islands in the northern archipelago on Georgian Bay. The expansive cottage is great for a large or extended family or a couple of families to share. The cottage is entirely yours, along with the dock, rocks, beach, water and island trails. Half of this 10 acre island belongs to the cottage. The other half is uninhabited.

This is a water-access only private island. You can bring your own boat, hire a water taxi from one of the marinas, or - if we are available, we are also able to shuttle people to the island. We can also provide 2 parking spots at Desmasdon's Marina, North Shore Road.
