Creating Stained Glass with Chalk!

Materials:

- Chalk
- Masking or painters tape
- Part of a wall/drive way/side walk or black board

Directions:

1. Use your tape to create a large square or rectangle - or any large shape
2. Within the larger shape use your tape to make smaller shapes like triangles throughout
3. Using chalk, colour in the smaller shapes you have made. If you are using different colours of chalk to colour try to make sure that the you don't put the same colour beside each other. If you only have one colour of chalk for colouring that is fine too!
4. Instead of colouring in your smaller shapes you may also draw some pictures and write some hopeful Easter words like "Halleluiah"
5. After you are done colouring and designing peel away the tape and take a look at your 'stained glass' creation!

If you don't have chalk available you could also try drawing your 'tape lines' on a piece of paper and then colouring with crayons or whatever you have on hand!

You could also draw an Easter picture and hang it up in a window in your house so people walking by can see what you have created!



Baking Resurrection Rolls!

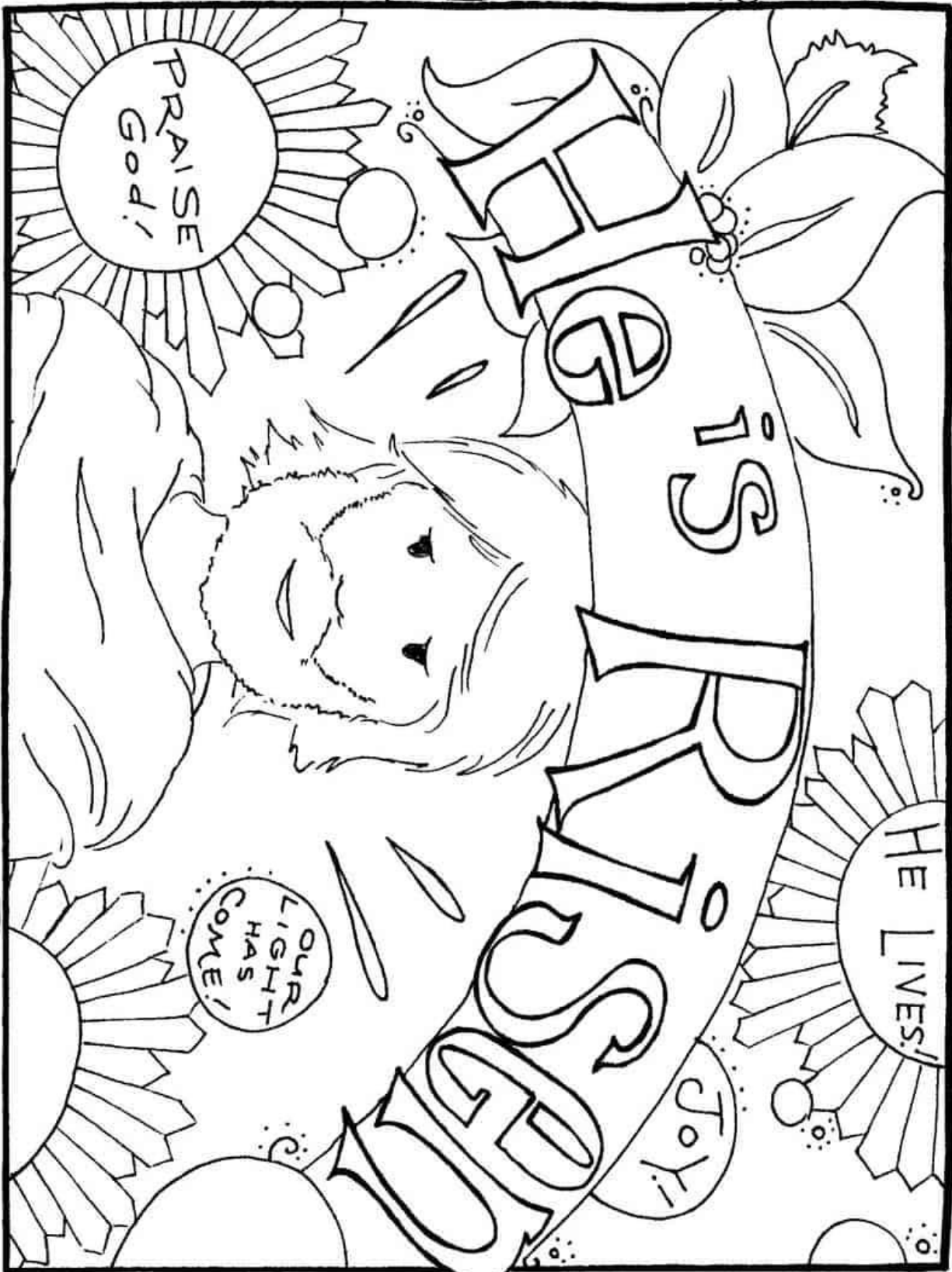
Ingredients:

- crescent rolls
- marshmallows
- sugar
- cinnamon (or red sprinkles)
- melted butter

Directions:

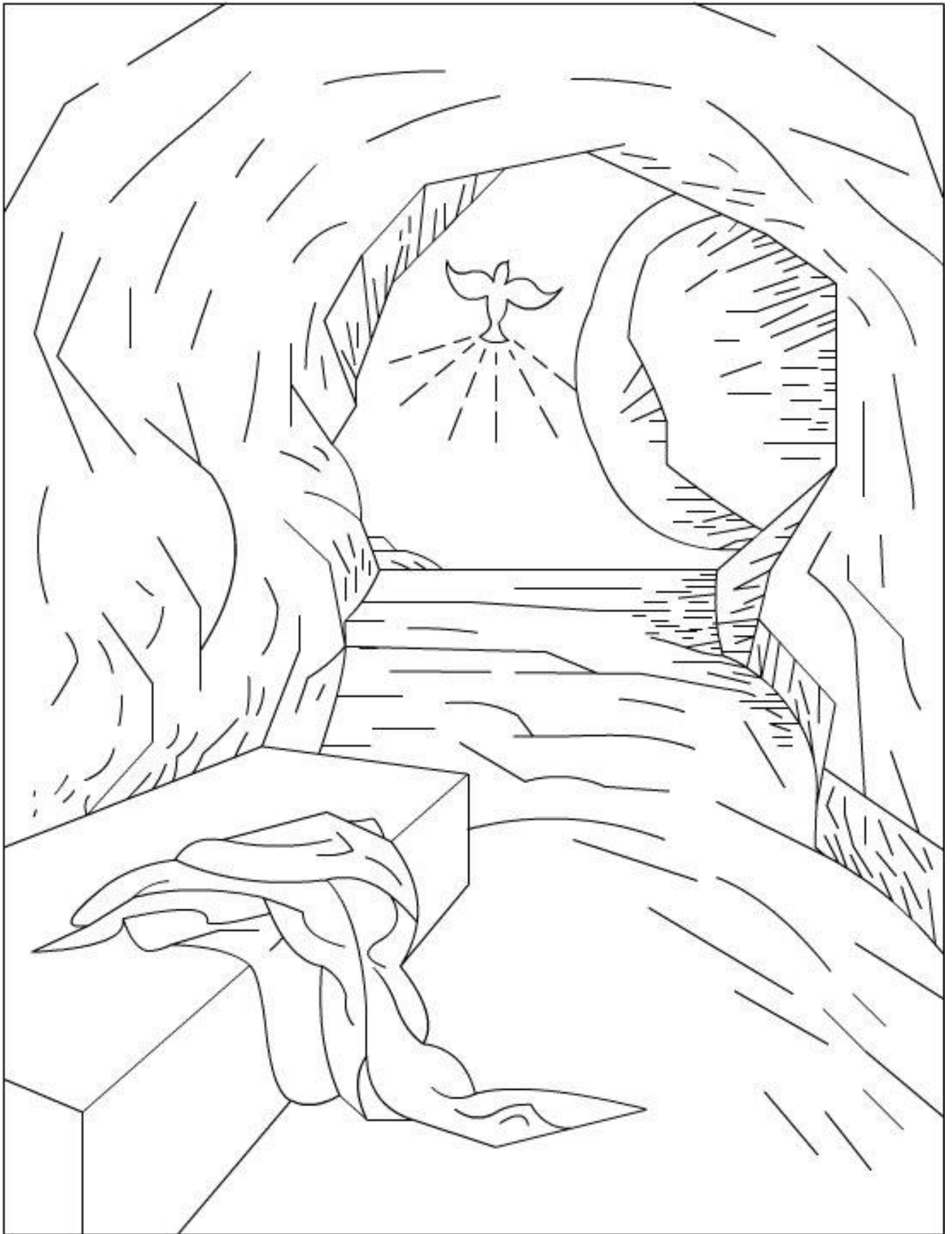
1. Preheat the oven as directed on the packaging of your crescent rolls
2. Spread out the crescent roll triangles individually on a baking sheet.
****These represent Jesus' tomb****
3. Roll one marshmallow first in the melted butter and then in the sugar & cinnamon/sprinkle mixture.
****This represents Jesus' body being prepared for burial with oil and spices****
4. Place the spiced marshmallow in the center of the crescent roll, wrap it up, and press the edges together so the crescent roll seals.
****This represents the tomb being sealed with the stone****
5. Bake the crescent rolls according to the directions on the package.
6. After they cool a bit, open up one of the rolls.
****The marshmallow is gone - the tomb is empty - Jesus is alive!****
