
God is made human in this wonderful birth: The world is cleansed through the rule of Christ.


Station at the Crèche: Susan Haig

- Priest: We believe in Jesus Christ, flesh of our flesh, bone of our bone;


All: he came in the body to give worth to every human life. He touched the untouchable loved the unlovable and endured slander, persecution and death.
