The Canticles

Monday: The New Jerusalem

Isaiah 60.1-3, 11ab, 14cd, 18-19

All: Arise, shine, for your light has come; *
the glory of the Lord has risen upon you.
Though night still covers the earth *
and darkness covers the nations,

Over you will the Lord arise, *
over you will his glory appear.
Nations will stream to your light *
and kings to your dawning brightness.

Your gates will always be open; *
day or night, they will never be shut.
They will call you, The City of the Lord, *
The Zion of the Holy One of Israel.

Violence will no more be heard in your land, *
ruin or destruction within your borders;
you will name your walls, Salvation, *
you will call your gates, Praise.

No longer will the sun be your light by day, *
no longer the moon give you light by night;
the Lord will be your eternal light; *
your God will be your glory.

Tuesday: A Song of Wisdom

Wisdom 10.15-19, 20b-21

All: Wisdom freed from a nation of oppressors *
a holy people and blameless race.
She entered the soul of a servant of the Lord, *
withstood dread kings with wonders and signs.

To the saints she gave the reward of their labours, *
and led them by a marvellous way;
she was their shelter by day *
and their starlight through the night.

She brought them across the Red Sea, *
led them through mighty waters,
but their enemies she swallowed in the waves *
and spat them out from the depths of the abyss.

Lord, the righteous sang hymns to your name, *
and praised with one voice your protecting hand,
for Wisdom opened the mouths of the dumb, *
and gave speech to the tongues of babes.

Wednesday: A Song from Ezekiel

Ezekiel 36.24–28

All: I will take you from the nations,
and gather you from every country,
and bring you home to your own land.

I will pour clean water upon you,
purify you from all defilement,
and cleanse you from all your idols.

A new heart I will give you,
and put a new spirit within you;
I will take from your body the heart of stone
and give you a heart of flesh.

I will put my spirit within you,

you shall be my people
and I will be your God.

Thursday: The Bread of Heaven

Wisdom 16.20–21, 26

All: You gave your people angels' food *
and sent them bread from heaven,
ready to eat, though they did no work, *
rich in delights, and suiting every taste.

The food which you gave *
showed your sweetness toward your children.
It served the desire of those who ate, *
was changed to the flavour each one wished;

That the children you love might learn, O God, *
that not by various crops are they fed,
but it is your word which sustains *
all those who trust in you.

Friday: The Souls of the Righteous

Wisdom 3.1-8

All: The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God; *
no torment shall ever touch them.

In the eyes of the unwise they seemed to be dead, *
their departure was taken for defeat,
their going from us to be disaster; *
but they are in peace.

Though they appeared to be punished *
their hope is rich in immortality.
Small their affliction, great their blessing; *
God proved and found them worthy of himself.

Like gold in a furnace he tried them, *
and accepted them as an oblation.

In the moment of God's coming
they shall kindle into flame *
and run like sparks through the stubble.
They shall govern nations and peoples, *
and the Lord shall be their ruler for ever.

Saturday: The Beatitudes

Matthew 5.3-12

All: Blessed are the poor in spirit, *
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
Blessed are those who mourn, *
for they shall be comforted.
Blessed are the gentle, *
for they shall inherit the earth.
Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for what is right, *
for they shall be satisfied.
Blessed are the merciful, *
for mercy shall be shown to them.
Blessed are the pure in heart, *
for they shall see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers, *
for they shall be called children of God.
Blessed are those who are persecuted in the cause of right, *
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you *
and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely for my sake.
Rejoice and be glad, *
for your reward is great in heaven.

The Reading

Statement of Faith

Monday

One: We believe in God
All: **who is older than eternity
and younger than our next breath;
who is beyond describing
yet knows us all by name;
who inspires faith
yet cannot be contained by religion.**

One: We believe in Jesus Christ,
All: **flesh of our flesh, bone of our bone;
he came in the body
to give worth to every human life.
He touched the untouchable
loved the unlovable
and endured slander, persecution and death.**

One: We believe that God's Kingdom comes on earth
through Christ's suffering love.
All: **He rose from the grave as living proof
that what is laid down in faith
will be raised in glory.
He ascended to heaven
to be present in all times to all people.**

One: We believe in the Holy Spirit,
All: who leads us into truth and freedom,
who gives good gifts to all God's children,
who works through prayer and politics,
through justice, care of creation
and the healing of the nations.

One: We celebrate the potential God has given:
All: the life in our bodies,
the yearning in our souls,
the promise of good things in store
for those who love and serve their maker. Amen.

Tuesday

One: We believe
All: that God is present in the darkness before dawn;
in the waiting and uncertainty
where fear and courage join hands, conflict and caring link arms,
and the sun rises over barbed wire.

We believe in a with-us God
who sits down in our midst to share our humanity.
We affirm a faith that takes us beyond a safe place:
into action, into vulnerability and onto the streets.

We commit ourselves to work for change
and put ourselves on the line;
to bear responsibility, take risks, live powerfully and face humiliation;
to stand with those on the edge;
to choose life and be used by the Spirit
for God's new community of hope. Amen.

Wednesday

One: I believe in God,
All: the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
I believe in Jesus Christ,
his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

Thursday

One: We believe

All: in the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob,
who journeys with us through life,
and leads us to new beginnings.

We believe in the God of Moses,
who frees us from oppression and guides us
through desert, wilderness, and sin to the Promised Land.

We believe in the God of the prophets,
who asks for justice in our land,
and cares for the poor.

We believe in Jesus Christ,
who brought the Gospel to us,
who celebrated God's unconditional love for everyone.

We believe in the Holy Spirit,
who forms and molds us into God's image,
who sends us out to serve God and people,
who leads us to everlasting life. Amen.

Friday

One: We believe in God above us,

All: Maker and Sustainer of all life,
of sun and moon, of water and earth, of male and female.

We believe in God beside us,
Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh,
born of a woman, servant of the poor,
tortured and nailed to a tree.

A man of compassion, he died forsaken;
he descended into the earth to the place of death.
On the third day he rose from the tomb;
he ascended into heaven to be everywhere present;
and his kingdom will come on earth.

We believe in God within us,
the Holy Spirit of Pentecostal fire,
life-giving breath of the church,
spirit of healing and forgiveness,
source of resurrection and eternal life. Amen.

Saturday

One: We believe in God

All: in whom is power and compassion.

We believe in the Creator who gave birth to the universe,
set solar systems dancing in space,
shaped molecules and mountains,
and conceived beauty beyond our imagining.

God's power topples tyrants,
and brings down walls of separation;
God's love embodies the tenderness of a mother and father,
encouraging and caring for each of us.

We believe in Jesus, born in obscurity in an occupied land;
a human being, vulnerable to hunger thirst, persecution and grief.
He understood the power of love
and confronted the powers of evil,
spoke the truth with courage and clarity,
forgave his enemies and changed lives.
In his living, dying and rising again
he showed love strong enough to save the world.

Confession

Monday

One: O Holy One,
we call to you and name you as eternal,
ever-present, and boundless in love.

when we fail to recognize you in the moment,
because we are so preoccupied with our daily lives.
Sometimes shame clenches tightly around our hearts,
and we hide our true feelings.

and we degrade our own wisdom.

**All: Holy God, in the daily round from sunrise to sunset,
remind us again of your holy presence hovering near us and in us.
Free us from shame and self-doubt.
Help us to see you in the moment-by-moment possibilities
to live honestly, to act courageously,
and to speak from our convictions.
In your name we pray. Amen.**

Tuesday

One: Dear God, we thank you for all that is good,
for our creation and our humanity,
for the stewardship you have given us of this planet earth,
for the gifts of life and of one another,
for your love which is unbounded and eternal.

**All: Merciful God,
we have not loved you with our whole heart,
nor our neighbours as ourselves.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
forgive what we have been,
accept us as we are,
and guide what we shall be.**

One: O God of mercy, you forgive our past sin,
you strengthen us in your gift of eternal life, you shape us for glory.
O God of mercy, we thank you. Amen.

Wednesday

One: Come, let us return to the Lord and say:

**All: Creator God, in our sin we have avoided your call.
Our love for you is like a morning cloud,
like the dew that goes away early.
Have mercy on us; deliver us from judgment;
bind up our wounds and revive us;
in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

One: The Lord enrich you with grace,
and nourish you with many blessings;
the Lord defend you in trouble
and keep you from all evil;
the Lord accept your prayers,
and absolve you from your offences,
for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. Amen.

Thursday

One: We have wounded your love.

All: O God, heal us.

One: We have wounded your love.

All: Light of the world, transfigure us.

One: We have wounded your love.

All: Spirit of God, dwell in us.

One: Eternal Spirit.

**All: living God,
in whom we live and move and have our being,
all that we are, have been, and shall be
is known to you.
In the very secret of our hearts
you know all that rises to trouble us.
Living flame, burn into us.
Cleansing wind, blow through us.
Fountain of water, well up within us;
that we may love and praise
in deed and in truth. Amen.**

Friday

One: God is steadfast in love and infinite in mercy;
he welcomes sinners and invites them to his table.
Let us confess our sins, confident in God's forgiveness.

**All: Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us,
that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your name. Amen.**

One: Almighty God have mercy upon us,
pardon and deliver us from all our sins,
confirm and strengthen us in all goodness,
and keep us in eternal life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Saturday

One: Gracious God, our sins are too heavy to carry,
too real to hide, and too deep to undo.
Forgive what our lips tremble to name,
what our hearts can no longer bear,
and what has become for us a consuming fire of judgment.

**All: Set us free from a past that we cannot change;
open to us a future in which we can be changed;
and grant us grace to grow more and more
in your likeness and image,
through Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Amen.**
