

The Readings

We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise

of this ministry?

Presenters:

We certify to you that she has been duly selected, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.

The Bishop says to the Ordinand

Bishop:

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

Ordinand:

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada.

The Ordinand signs the above declaration in the sight of all present

Bishop:

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Paige Chantal Souter for ordination to the sacred priesthood. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime for which we should not proceed, come forward now and make it known.

If no objection is made, the Bishop continues

Bishop:

Is it your will that Paige be ordained a priest?

People:

It is.

Bishop:

Will you uphold her in this ministry?

People:

We will.

The Examination

Please be seated

The Ordinand stands before the Bishop

Bishop:

Paige, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Saviour and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

Bishop: As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to preside at the administration of holy baptism and at the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's body and blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you.

In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and to strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come. Do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood?

Ordinand: I believe I am so called.

Bishop: Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Ordinand: I do.

Bishop: Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the holy scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you endeavour so to minister the word of God and the sacraments of the new covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, labouring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you do your best to pattern your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, and offering all your labours to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

Litanist: That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit she may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: For all who fear God and believe in you, Lord Christ, that our divisions may cease and that all may be one as you and the Father are one, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: For the mission of the Church, that in faithful witness it may preach the gospel to the ends of the earth, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: For those who do not yet believe, and for those who have lost their faith, that they may receive the light of the gospel, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: For ourselves: for the forgiveness of our sins, and for the grace of the Holy Spirit to amend our lives, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: For all who have died in the communion of the Church, and those whose faith is known to you alone, that they may have rest in that place where there is no pain or grief, but life eternal, we pray to you, O Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

Litanist: Rejoicing in the fellowship of the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, let us commend ourselves, and one another, and all our life to Christ our God.

All: To you, O Lord.

Bishop: Almighty and eternal God, ruler of all things in heaven and earth, mercifully accept the prayers of your people, and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

The Prayer of Consecration

Bishop:

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.

We praise and glorify you that by his death Christ has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body.

And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

Here the Bishop and Priests lay their hands on the head of the Ordinand

Bishop:

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Paige, whom we now consecrate in your name to the office and work of a priest in the Church.

The Bishop then continues, with hands extended

Bishop:

Almighty Father, give to this your servant grace and power to fulfill her ministry among the people committed to her charge; to watch over them and care for them; to absolve and bless them in your name; and to proclaim the gospel of your salvation. Set her among your people to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable in your sight, and as you have called her to your service, make her by the gift of your Holy Spirit worthy of her calling. Give her wisdom and discipline to work faithfully with all her fellow servants in Christ, that the world may come to know your glory and your love.

Bishop:

Accept our prayers, most merciful Father, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever.





You wait for me and only I can let you in.


I believe and trust in you and ask you now to fill me with your presence.
