# Daily Prayer

## Feria

## Wednesday, October 2, 2024

We enter into a time of quiet. We offer to God our selves and in the silence know that God embraces us as God's very own. We offer our hopes and our concerns through our prayers and in the silence listen for God. Today we hold in our prayers the ordinary moments in life—the trials and the joys. We begin by saying

O Lord, open our lips.

And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Make me to know your ways, O Lord, and teach me your paths.

## The First Reading

Then Job answered:

'Indeed I know that this is so;

but how can a mortal be just before God?

If one wished to contend with him,

one could not answer him once in a thousand.

He is wise in heart, and mighty in strength

—who has resisted him, and succeeded?—

he who removes mountains, and they do not know it,

when he overturns them in his anger;

who shakes the earth out of its place,

and its pillars tremble;

who commands the sun, and it does not rise;

who seals up the stars;

who alone stretched out the heavens

and trampled the waves of the Sea;

who made the Bear and Orion,

the Pleiades and the chambers of the south; who does great things beyond understanding, and marvellous things without number.

Look, he passes by me, and I do not see him; he moves on, but I do not perceive him.

He snatches away; who can stop him?

Who will say to him, "What are you doing?"

'God will not turn back his anger;
the helpers of Rahab bowed beneath him.
How then can I answer him,
choosing my words with him?
Though I am innocent, I cannot answer him;
I must appeal for mercy to my accuser.
If I summoned him and he answered me,
I do not believe that he would listen to my voice.

### The Psalm

## The Gospel Reading

As they were going along the road, someone said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' And Jesus said to him, 'Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests; but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' To another he said, 'Follow me.' But he said, 'Lord, first let me go and bury my father.' But Jesus said to him, 'Let the dead bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.' Another said, 'I will follow you, Lord; but let me first say farewell to those at my home.' Jesus said to him, 'No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

In silence, we ask what the readings have to say to us today. Is there something that draws us more deeply into the reading? What does God have to say to us? What do we have to ask God?

When the time is right, we conclude our time of silence with the canticle

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

We pray for all through whom we receive sustenance and life; for farmers and agricultural workers, for packers, distributors and company boards; as you have so ordered our life that we depend upon each other, enable us by your grace to seek the well-being of others before our own.

#### Lord of all creation:

#### hear our prayer

We pray for all engaged in research to safeguard crops against disease,

and to produce abundant life among those who hunger and whose lives are at risk.

Prosper the work of their hands

and the searching of their minds,

that their labour may be for the welfare of all.

Lord of all wisdom:

#### hear our prayer.

We pray for governments and aid agencies, and those areas of the world where there is disaster, drought and starvation.

By the grace of your Spirit,

touch our hearts

and the hearts of all who live in comfortable plenty, and make us wise stewards of your gifts.

Lord of all justice:

#### hear our prayer.

We pray for those who are ill, remembering those in hospital and nursing homes and all who are known to us.

We pray for all who care for them.

Give skill and understanding

to all who work for their well-being.

Lord of all compassion:

#### hear our prayer.

We remember those who have died, whom we entrust to your eternal love in the hope of resurrection to new life.

#### Lord of all peace:

#### hear our prayer.

We offer ourselves to your service, asking that by the Spirit at work in us others may receive a rich harvest of love and joy and peace. Lord of all faithfulness:

#### hear our prayer.

God of grace, as you are ever at work in your creation, so fulfil your wise and loving purpose in us and in all for whom we pray, that with them and in all that you have made, your glory may be revealed and the whole earth give praise to you, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

you are our guide on our journey through life and the light on our way.

Shine, we pray, in all places of darkness of our lives, that in all our confusions we may know your guidance, in all our doubts we may know your hope and in all our loneliness we may know your peace, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
