Leader: We acknowledge and embrace the pain of the past, O God, and we offer it to You, asking that into our wounded hearts and open hands You will place the gift of peace, shalom.

All: We remember that through You all things are possible. Refresh, restore, and renew us, O God.

Third Candle

Priest: We light this third candle to remember ourselves this Christmas time. We pause and remember the past weeks, months, and for some of us years, that have been heavy with our burdens.

Be still and aware of God's presence within and all around

Priest: We accept and lay before you, God, the sharpness of memory, the sadness and grief, the hurt and fear, the anger and pain. We accept and lay before you the ways we feel we have fallen short, and the times we have spent blaming ourselves, and you, for all that we have suffered.

All: We remember that dawn defeats the darkness.

Fourth Candle

Leader: We light this fourth candle to remember faith, the gift of light and hope that God offers to us in the story of Christmas.

Be still and aware of God's presence within and all around

Leader: We remember that the loving God who came to share this life with us promises us comfort and peace.
