Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Protect me, O God, for I take refuge <u>in</u> you;
- (2) I have said to the Lord, "You are my Lord, my good above all other."
- (3) All my delight is upon the godly that are in $\underline{\text{the}}$ land,
- (4) upon those who are noble a $\underline{\text{mong}}$ the people. R.
- (1) But those who run after other gods
- (2) shall have their troubles multiplied.
- (3) Their libations of blood I will not offer,
- (4) nor take the names of their gods up<u>on</u> my lips. R.
- (1) O Lord, you are my portion and my cup;
- (2) it is you who uphold \underline{my} lot.
- (3) My boundaries enclose a pleasant land;
- (4) indeed, I have a goodly heritage. **R**.
- (1) I will bless the Lord who gives \underline{me} counsel;
- (2) my heart teaches me, night after night,
- (3) I have set the Lord always <u>before</u> me;
- (4) because he is at my right hand I $\underline{\text{shall}}$ not fall. R.
