- (2) truly, my hope is in him.
- (3) He alone is my rock and my salvation,
- (4) my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken. **R.**

- (1) In God is my safety and my honour;
- (2) God is my strong rock and my refuge.
- (3) Put your trust in him always, O people,
- (4) pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge. **R.**

- (1) Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath,
- (2) even those of low estate cannot be trusted.
- (3) On the scales they are lighter than a breath,
- (4) all of them together. **R.**

- (1) Put no trust in extortion;
- (2) in robbery take no empty pride;
- (4) though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it. **R.**

- (1) God has spoken once, twice have I heard it,
- (2) that power belongs to God.
- (3) Steadfast love is yours, O Lord,
- (4) for you repay everyone according to his deeds. **R.**
