Introduction

Turn to me; save the child of your hand - maid.

- (1) Bow down your ear, O Lord, and answer me,
- (2) for I am poor and in misery.
- (3) Keep watch over my life, for I am faithful;
- (6) save your servant who puts his trust in you. **R.**

- (1) Be merciful to me, O Lord, for you are my God;
- (2) I call upon you all the day long.
- (3) Gladden the soul of your servant,
- (4) for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.
- (5) For you, O Lord, are good and forgiving,
- (6) and great is your love toward all who call upon you. **R.**

- (1) Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer,
- (2) and attend to the voice of my supplications.
- (3) In the time of my trouble I will call upon you,
- (4) for you will answer me. **R.**

- (1) Among the gods there is none like you, O Lord,
- (2) nor anything like your works.
- (3) All nations you have made will come
and worship you, O Lord,
- (4) and glorify your name.
- (5) For you are great; you do wondrous things;
- (6) and you alone are God. **R.**

- (1) Turn to me and have mercy upon me;
- (2) give your strength to your servant,
- (3) and save the child of your handmaid.
- (4) Show me a sign of your favour,
- (5) so that those who hate me may see it
and be ashamed;
- (6) because you, O Lord, have helped me
and comforted me. **R.**
