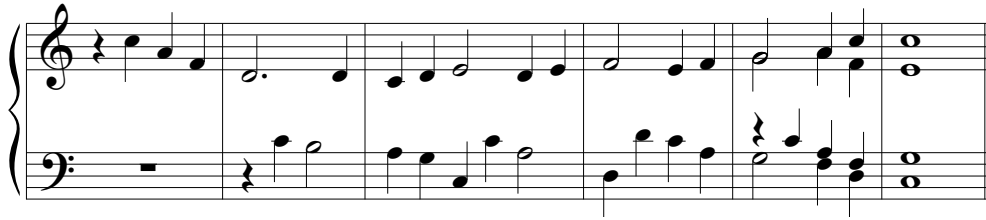


# Psalm 22, 22-30
