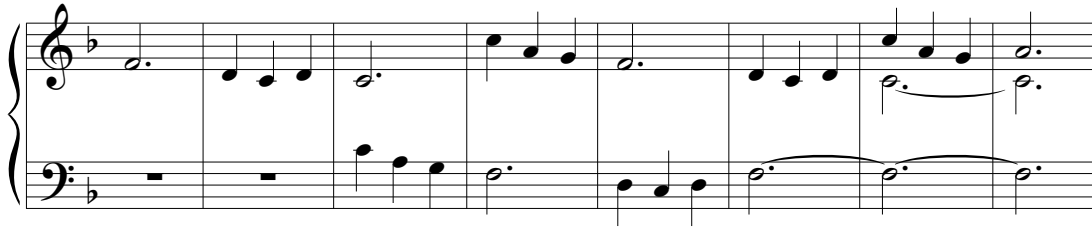


Psalm 80.7-14, Proper 27A

- (1) Restore us, O God of hosts;
- (2) show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.
- (1) You have brought a vine out of Egypt;
- (2) you cast out the nations and planted it.
- (3) You prepared the ground for it;
- (4) it took root and filled the land. **R.**

- (1) The mountains were covered by its shadow
- (2) and the towering cedar trees by its boughs.
- (3) You stretched out its tendrils to the Sea
- (4) and its branches to the River. **R.**

- (1) Why have you broken down its wall,
so that all who pass by pluck off its grapes?
- (2) The wild boar of the forest has ravaged it,
and the beasts of the field have grazed upon it.
- (3) Turn now, O God of hosts, look down from heaven;
behold and tend this vine;
- (4) preserve what your right hand has planted. **R.**
