- (3) With his right hand and his holy arm
- (4) he has won for himself the victory. **R.**

- (1) The Lord has made known his victory;
- (2) his righteousness has he openly shown in the sight of the nations.
- (3) He remembers his mercy and faithfulness to the house of Israel,
- (4) and all the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God. **R.**

- (1) Shout with joy to the Lord, all you lands;
- (2) lift up your voice, rejoice, and sing.
- (3) Sing to the Lord with the harp,
- (4) with the harp and the voice of song. **R.**

- (1) With trumpets and the sound of the horn
- (2) shout with joy before the King, the Lord.
- (3) Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it,
- (4) the lands and those who dwell therein. **R.**

- (1) Let the rivers clap their hands,
and let the hills ring out with joy before the Lord,
- (2) when he comes to judge the earth.
- (3) In righteousness shall he judge the world
- (4) and the peoples with equity. **R.**
