- (1) Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord;
- (2) we bless you from the house of the Lord.
- (3) God is the Lord; he has shined upon us;
- (4) form a procession with branches up to the horns of the altar **R**.
- (1) "You are my God, and I will thank you;
- (2) you are my God, and I will exalt you."
- (3) Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good;
- (4) his mercy endures for ever. \mathbf{R} .
