(1) Great things are they that you have done, O Lord my God!

(1) how great your wonders and your plans for us!

(2) there is none who can be compared with you.

(1) In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure

(2) (you have given me ears to hear you);

(3) burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not required,
