
Psalm 81.1-10

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Sing with joy to God our <u>strength</u>
- (2) and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacob
- (1) Raise a song and sound the <u>timb</u>rel,
- (2) the merry harp, and <u>the</u> lyre.
- (3) Blow the ram's-horn at the new moon,
- (4) and at the full moon, the day of our <u>feast</u>. *R*.
- (1) For this is a statute for <u>Is</u>rael,
- (2) a law of the God <u>of</u> Jacob.
- (3) He laid it as a solemn charge upon <u>Jo</u>seph,
- (4) when he came out of the land of Egypt. R.

(1) I heard an unfamiliar voice saying,

"I eased his shoulder from the <u>bur</u>den;

- (2) his hands were set free from bearing the load."
- (3) You called on me in trouble, and I <u>saved</u> you;
- (3) I answered you from the secret place of $\underline{\text{thun}}\text{der}$
- (4) and tested you at the waters of <u>Mer</u>ibah. R.
- (1) Hear, O my people, and I will admonish you:
- (2) O Israel, if you would but listen to me!
- (1) There shall be no strange god among you;
- (2) you shall not worship a foreign god.
- (3) I am the Lord your God,

who brought you out of the land of Egypt and said,

(4) "Open your mouth wide, and I will <u>fill</u> it." **R.**
