
Psalm 107.1-3,23-32

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) "O give thanks, for the Lord is gracious;
- (2) God's steadfast love endures for ever."
- (1) So let the people say whom the Lord <u>has</u> redeemed,
- (2) whom the Lord has redeemed from the hand of the enemy,
- (3) and gathered out of the lands,
- (4) from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south. R.
- (1) Some went down to the <u>sea</u> in ships
- (2) and plied their trade in <u>deep</u> waters;
- (1) They beheld the works of the Lord
- (2) and his wonders in the deep.
- (3) Then he spoke, and a stormy wind <u>a</u>rose,
- (4) which tossed high the waves of the $\underline{\text{sea}}$. R
- (1) They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths;
- (2) their hearts melted because of their peril.
- (3) They reeled and staggered <u>like</u> drunkards
- (4) and were at their wits' end. \mathbf{R} .

- (1) Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble,
- (2) and he delivered them from their \underline{di} stress.
- (1) He stilled the storm to a whisper
- (2) and quieted the waves of the sea.
- (3) Then were they glad because of the calm,
- (4) and he brought them to the harbour they were \underline{bound} for. R.
- (1) Let them give thanks to the Lord <u>for</u> his mercy
- (2) and the wonders he does for $\underline{\text{his}}$ children.
- (3) Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people
- (4) and praise him in the council of the <u>elders</u>. **R**
