Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.

- (1) O God, I have set you always <u>before</u> me;
- (1) because you are at my right hand I shall <u>not</u> fall.
- (2) My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit rejoices;
- (2) my body also shall rest in hope.
- (3) For you will not abandon me to the grave, nor let your holy one see the Pit.
- (3) You will show me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy,
- (4) and in your right hand are pleasures for ever<u>möre</u>. **R**.
