Psalm 37.1-12,41-42

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Do not fret yourself because of evildoers;
 - do not be jealous of those who do wrong.
- (2) For they shall soon wither like the grass, and like the green grass fade <u>a</u>way.
- (3) Put your trust in God and do good; dwell in the land and feed on its riches.
- (4) Take delight in God, who will give you your heart's desire. **R.**
- (1) Commit your way to God and put your trust in the Holy One,
- (2) and God will surely bring it to pass.
- (3) God will make your righteousness as clear as the light
- (4) and your just dealing as $\underline{\text{the}}$ noonday. R.
- (1) Be still before the Most High and wait patiently <u>for</u> God.
- (2) Do not fret yourself over the one who prospers, the one who succeeds in evil schemes.
- (3) Refrain from anger, leave rage <u>a</u>lone;
- (4) do not fret yourself; it leads only \underline{to} evil. \mathbf{R} .
- (1) For evildoers shall be cut off,
- (2) but those who wait upon God shall possess the land.
- (3) In a little while the wicked shall be <u>no</u> more;
- (3) you shall search out their place, but they will not <u>be</u> there.
- (4) But the lowly shall possess the land; they will delight in abundance <u>of</u> peace. *R*.
- (1) But their deliverance of the righteous comes <u>from</u> God;
- (2) who is their stronghold in time <u>of</u> trouble.
- (3) God will help them and res<u>cue</u> them;
- (4) save them from the wicked and deliver them, because they seek refuge in the Most High. **R.**
