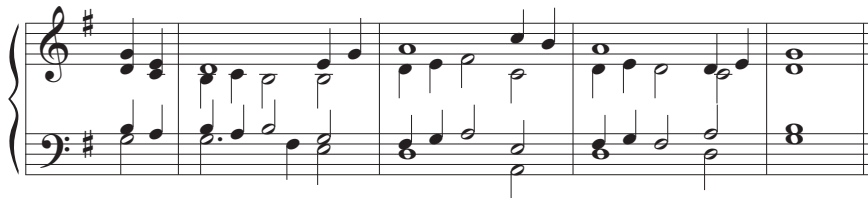



Psalm 63.1-8

Introduction



I will feast at a rich— ta - ble, my— lips— sing of your glo - ry.



- (1) O God, you are my God; eagerly I seek you;
- (2) My soul thirsts for you,
- (3) my flesh faints for you,
- (4) as in a barren and dry land where there is no water.
- (5) Therefore I have gazed upon you in your holy place,
- (6) that I might behold your power and your glory. **R.**

- (1) For your loving-kindness is better than life itself;
- (2) my lips shall give you praise.
- (3) So will I bless you as long as I live
- (4) and lift up my hands in your name.
- (5) My soul is content, as with marrow and fatness,
- (6) and my mouth praises you with joyful lips. **R.**

- (1) When I remember you upon my bed,
- (2) and meditate on you in the night watches.
- (3) For you have been my helper,
- (4) and under the shadow of your wings I will rejoice.
- (5) My soul clings to you;
- (6) your right hand holds me fast. **R.**
