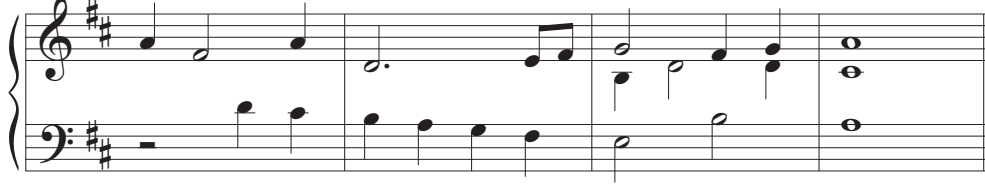


Psalm 112: 1-9 (10)

- (1) Happy are they who fear God
 - (2) and have great delight in the commandments of the Holy One!
 - (1) Their descendants will be mighty in the land;
 - (2) the generation of the upright will be blessed.
 - (3) Wealth and riches will be in their house,
 - (4) and their righteousness will last for ever. **R.**
-
- (1) Light shines in the darkness for the upright;
 - (2) the righteous are merciful and full of compassion.
 - (3) It is good for them to be generous in lending
 - (4) and to manage their affairs with justice. **R.**
-
- (1) For they will never be shaken;
 - (2) the righteous will be kept in everlasting remembrance.
 - (3) They will not be afraid of any evil rumours;
 - (4) their heart is right; they put their trust in God. **R.**
-
- (1) Their heart is established and will not shrink,
 - (2) until they see their desire upon their enemies.
 - (3) They have given freely to the poor, and their righteousness stands fast for ever;
 - (4) they will hold up their head with honour. **R.**
-
- (1) *The wicked will see it and be angry;*
 - (2) *they will gnash their teeth and pine away;*
 - (4) *the desires of the wicked will perish. **R.***
- (The last stanza may be omitted)*
