

Psalm 32




Introduction

O God, you for-gave me the guilt of my sin.



- (1) Happy are they whose transgressions are for-given,
- (2) and whose sin is put away!
- (3) Happy are they to whom God imputes no guilt,
- (4) and in whose spirit there is no guile! **R.**

- (1) While I held my tongue, my bones withered away,
- (2) because of my groaning all day long.
- (3) For your hand was heavy upon me day and night;
- (4) my moisture was dried up as in the heat of summer. **R.**

- (1) Then I acknowledged my sin to you,
- (2) and did not conceal my guilt.
- (3) I said, "I will confess my transgressions to God."
- (4) Then you forgave me the guilt of my sin. **R.**

- (1) Therefore all the faithful will make their prayers to you in time of trouble;
- (2) when the great waters overflow, they shall not reach them.
- (3) You are my hiding-place; you preserve me from trouble;
- (4) you surround me with shouts of deliverance. **R.**

- (1) "I will instruct you and teach you in the way that you should go;
- (2) I will guide you with my eye.
- (3) Do not be like horse or mule, which have no understanding;
- (4) who must be fitted with bit and bridle,
or else they will not stay near you." **R.**

- (1) Great are the tribulations of the wicked;
- (2) but mercy embraces those who trust in God.
- (3) Be glad, you righteous, and rejoice in God;
- (4) shout for joy, all who are true of heart. **R.**
