



Psalm 95

- (5) They put me to the test,
- (6) though they had seen my works. **R.**

I was grieved with that generation and said,
- (3) "This people are wayward in their hearts;
- (4) they do not know my ways."
- (5) So I swore in my wrath,
- (6) "They shall not enter into my rest." **R.**
