- (2) and the glorious splendor of your majesty.
- (3) Your reign is everlasting
- (4) your dominion endures throughout all ages. **R.**

- (1) You, O God, are faithful in all your words
- (2) and merciful in all your deeds.
- (3) You uphold all those who fall;
- (4) and lift up those who are bowed down. **R.**
