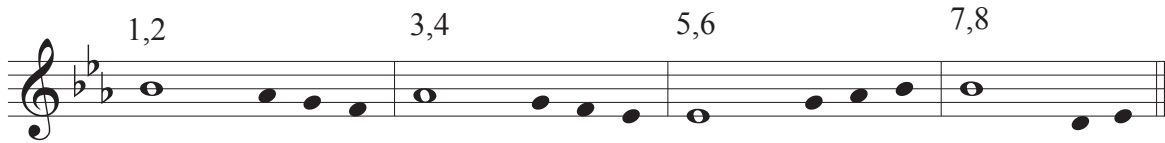


Psalm 136.1-9 Creation
