- (1) O praise God from the earth,
- (2) you sea-monsters and all deeps;
- (3) Fire and hail, snow and fog,
- (4) tempestuous wind, doing God's will; **R.**

- (1) Mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars:
- (2) Wild beasts and all cattle,
creeping things and flying birds;
- (1) Rulers of the earth and all peoples,
- (2) princes and all sovereigns of the world;
- (3) Young men and women,
- (4) old and young together. **R.**

- (1) Let them praise your name, O God,
- (2) for your name only is exalted,
your splendour is over earth and heaven.
- (3) You have raised up strength for your people
and praise for all your loyal servants,
- (4) the children of Israel, a people who are near you.
