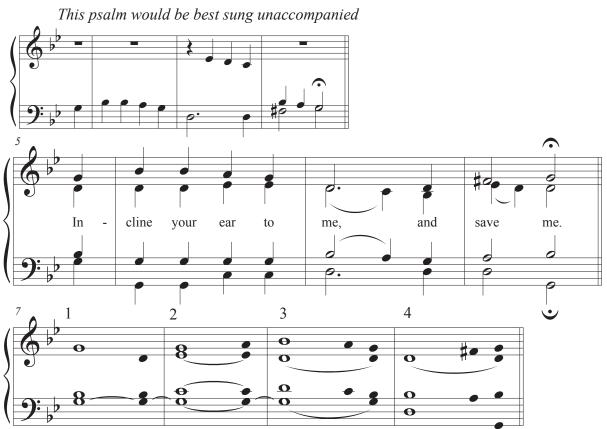
Psalm 71.1-14

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) In you, O God, have I taken refuge; let me never be a<u>shamed</u>.
- (2) In your righteousness deliver me and set me free; incline your ear to me and <u>save</u> me.
- (3) Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe;
- (4) you are my crag and my stronghold. *R*.
- (1) Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked, from the clutches of the evildoer and the oppressor.
- (2) For you are my hope, O God,
 - my confidence since I was young.
- (3) I have been sustained by you ever since I was born; from my mother's womb you have been <u>my</u> strength;
- (4) my praise shall be always \underline{of} you. *R*.
- (1) I have become a portent to many; but you are my refuge and my <u>strength</u>.
- (2) Let my mouth be full of your praise
- and your glory all the day long.
- (1) Do not cast me off in my old age;
- forsake me not when my strength <u>fails</u>. (2) For my enemies are talking against me,
- and those who lie in wait for my life take counsel together.
- (3) They say that God has forsaken me,
- (4) they can come and seize me for none \underline{can} save. *R*.
- (1) O God, be not far from me;
 - come quickly to help me, O my God.
- (2) Let those who set themselves against me be put to shame and be disgaced;
- (2) let those who seek to do me evil be covered with scorn and reproach.
- (3) But I shall always wait in patience,
- (4) and shall praise you more <u>and</u> more. *R*.
