- (1) Ascribe to the Holy One, you gods;
- (2) ascribe to the Holy One glory and strength.
- (3) Ascribe to God all glory, bless God's name;
- (4) worship God in the beauty of holiness. **R.**

- (1) The voice of the Holy One is upon the waters;
- (1) the God of glory thunders;
- (2) God is upon the mighty waters.
- (3) The voice of God is a powerful voice;
- (4) the voice of God is a voice of splendour. **R.**

- (1) The voice of the Holy One breaks the cedar trees;
- (2) God breaks the cedars of Lebanon.
- (3) God makes Lebanon skip like a calf,
- (4) and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox. **R.**

- (1) The voice of the Holy One splits the flames of fire;
- (1) the voice of God shakes the wilderness;
- (2) God shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.
- (3) The voice of the Holy One makes the oak trees writhe and strips the forests bare.
- (4) And in the temple of the Holy One all are crying, "Glory!" **R.**

- (1) God sits enthroned above the flood;
- (2) the Holy One sits enthroned, reigning for evermore.
- (3) The Holy One shall give strength to all people;
- (4) God shall give the people the blessing of peace. **R.**
