Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Fools have said in their hearts, "There is <u>no</u> God."
- (2) All are corrupt and commit abominable acts; there is none who does any good.
- (3) God looks down from heaven upon us all,
- (4) to see if there is any who is wise, if there is one who seeks <u>after God</u>. R.
- (1) Every one has proved faithless; all alike have <u>turned</u> bad;
- (2) there is none who does good; no, <u>not</u> one.
- (3) Have they no knowledge, all those evildoers
- (4) who eat up my people like bread and do not call <u>upon God?</u> R.
- (1) See how they tremble with fear,
- (2) because God is in the company of  $\underline{\text{the}}$  righteous.
- (1) Their aim is to confound the plans of the <u>afflicted</u>,
- (2) but God is <u>their</u> refuge.
- (3) Oh, that Israel's deliverance would come out of Zion!
- (4) when God restores the fortunes of the people, Jacob will rejoice and Israel be glad. **R**.
