



Psalm 52



- (2) You plot ruin; your tongue is like a sharpened razor, O worker of deception.
- (3) You love evil more than good and lying more than speaking the truth.
- (4) You love all words that hurt, O you deceitful tongue. **R.**

- (1) Oh, that God would demolish you utterly,
- (2) topple you, and snatch you from your dwelling, and root you out of the land of the living!
- (1) The righteous shall see and tremble,
- (2) they shall laugh at you, saying,
- (3) "This is the one who did not take God for a refuge,
- (4) but trusted in great wealth and relied upon wickedness." **R.**
