- (1) And yet my people did not hear my voice,
- (2) and Israel would not obey me.
- (3) So I gave them over to the stubbornness of their hearts,

- (2) that Israel would walk in my ways!
- (3) I should soon subdue their enemies
- (4) and turn my hand against their foes. **R.**

- (2) their punishment would last for ever.
- (3) But Israel would I feel with the finest wheat
- (4) and satisfy them with honey from the rock. **R.**
