*Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses.
All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves*

Introduction the reciting note on the underlines word or syllable

(1) Rejoice in God, you righteous;
(2) it is good for he just to sing praises.

(1) Praise God with the harp;
(2) play to the Holy One upon the psaltery and lyre.
(3) Sing fro God a new song;
(4) sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the trumpet **R.**

(1) For your work, O God is right,
(2) and all your works are sure.
(3) You love righteousness and justice;
(4) your loving-kindness fills the whole earth. **R.**

(1) By your word, O God, were the heavens made,
(2) by the breath of your mouth all the heavenly hosts.
(3) You gather up the waters of the ocean as in a water-skin
(4) and store up the depths of the sea. **R.**

(1) Let all the earth fear you, O God;
(2) let all who swell in the world stand in awe of you.
(3) For you spoke, and it came to pass;
(4) you commanded, and it stood fast. **R.**

(1) O God, you bring the will of the nations to naught;
(2) you thwart the designs of the peoples.
(1) But your will stands fast for ever,
(2) and the designs of your heart from age to age.
(3) Happy is the nation whose allegiance is to God;
(4) happy the people you have chosen to be your own! **R.**
