- (1) Blessed is the One who comes in the <u>name</u> of God;
- (2) we bless you from the house of God.
- (3) The Holy One has shined upon us;
- (4) form a procession with branches up to the horns of the altar. **R.**
- (1) "You are my God, and I will thanks you;
- (2) you are my God, and I will exalt you."
- (3) Give thanks to God, who is good,
- (4) whose mercy endures for ever. R
