

- (4) with the harp and the voice \underline{of} song. **R.**
- (1) With trumpets and the sound of the horn
- (2) shout with joy before our God, who reigns in majesty.
- (3) Let the sea make a noise and all that \underline{is} in it,
- (4) the lands and those who dwell therein. **R.**
- (1) Let the rivers clap their hands, and let the hills ring out with joy before their <u>God</u>,
- (2) who will come to judge the earth.
- (3) God will judge the world <u>in</u> righteousness
- (4) and the peoples with $\underline{\text{equity}}$. **R.**
