
Psalm 107.1-3,23-32

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) We give you thanks, O God, for you are good,
- (2) and your mercy endured for ever.
- (1) Let all those whom you redeemed proclaim
- (2) that you rescued them from the hand of the foe.
- (3) You gathered them out of the lands;
- (4) from the east and from the west, from the north and from the <u>south</u>. **R.**
- (1) Some went down to the sea in ships
- (2) and plied their trade in deep waters;
- (1) They beheld your works
- (2) and your wonders in the deep.
- (3) Then you spoke, and a stormy wind arose,
- (4) which tossed high the waves of the sea. R.
- (1) They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depth;
- (2) their hearts melted becasue of their peril.
- (3) They reeled and staggered like drunkards
- (4) and were at their wits' end. R.

- (1) Then they cried to you in their trouble,
- (2) and delivered them from their <u>di</u>stress.
- (1) You stilled the storm to a whisper
- (2) and quieted the waves of the sea.
- (3) Then were they glad because of the calm,
- (4) and you brought them to the harbour they were bound for. **R.**
- (1) Let them give thanks to you for your mercy
- (2) and the wonders you do for your children.
- (3) Let them exalt you in the congregation of the people
- (4) and praise you in the coucil of the elders. \mathbf{R} .
