- (1) It is a good thing to give thanks to God,
and to sing praises to your name, O Most High;
- (2) To tell of your loving-kindness early in the morning
and of your faithfulness in the night season;
- (3) On the psaltery, and on the lyre
and to the melody of the harp.
- (4) For you have made me glad by your acts, O God;
and I shout for joy because of the works of your hands. **R.**

- (1) The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree,
and shall spread abroad like a cedar of Lebanon.
- (2) Those who are planted in the house of God
shall flourish in the courts of the Holy One.
- (3) They shall still bear fruit in old age;
They shall be green and succulent;
- (4) That they may show how upright our God is,
my rock, in whom there is no fault. **R.**
