Introduction

The right - eous cry out, and you hear them.

- (1) Your eyes, O God, are upon the righteous,
- (2) You will listen to their cry.
- (3) Your face is against those who do evil,
- (4) to root out the remembrance of them from the earth. **R.**

- (1) The righteous cry, and you hear them
- (2) and deliver them from all their troubles.
- (3) You are near to the broken hearted
- (4) and will save those whose spirits are crushed. **R.**

- (1) Many are the troubles of the righteous,
- (2) but you will deliver them.
- (3) You will keep safe all their bones;
- (4) not one of them shall be broken. **R.**

- (1) Evil shall slay the wicked,
- (2) and those who hate the righteous will be punished.
- (3) You, God, ransom each faithful servant,
- (4) and none will be punished who trust in you. **R.**
