

Psalm 132.1-12, (13-18)



- (1) O God, remember David, and all the hardships he <u>en</u>dured;
- (2) How he swore an oath to you, a vow to the mighty One of Jacob;
- "I will not come under the roof of my house, nor climb up into <u>my</u> bed;
- (2) I will not allow my eyes to sleep, nor let me eye<u>lids</u> slumber;
- (3) Until I find you a resting place,
- (4) a dwelling for the Might One of <u>Jacob</u>." **R.**
- (1) "The ark! We heard is was in Ephratah; we found it in the fields of Jearim.
- (2) Let us go to your dwelling place, O God; let us fall upon our knees before your footstool."
- (3) Arise, O God, into your resting-place, you and the ark of your strength.
- (4) Let your priests be clothed with righteousness; let your faithful people sing <u>with</u> joy. R.
- (1) For your servant David's sake, do not turn away from the face of your <u>a</u>nointed.
- (2) The Most High has sworn an oath to David in faithfulness, and will <u>not</u> break it;
- "A son, the fruit of your body will I set upon <u>your</u> throne.
- (2) If your children keep my covenant
- (3) and my testimonies that I shall teach them,
- (4) their children will sit upon your throne for evermore. R.

- (1) For I have chosen Zion,
- I have desired her for my habitation:
- (2) "This shall be my resting-place for ever; here will I dwell, for I delight <u>in</u> her.
- (3) I will surely bless her provisions,
- (4) and satisfy her poor $\underline{\text{with}}$ bread. **R.**
- (1) I will clothe her priests with salvation, and her faithful people will rejoice and sing.
- (2) There will I make the horn of David flourish; I have prepared a lamp for my <u>annointed</u>.
- (3) As for his enemies, I will clothe them with shame;
- (4) but as for him, his crown will shine." R.
