(1) We give you thanks, O God, for you are good,
(2) and your mercy endured for ever.
(1) Let all those whom you redeemed proclaim
(2) that you rescued them from the hand of the foe.
(3) You gathered them out of the lands;
(4) from the east and from the west,
from the north and from the south. **R.**

(1) Some wandered in desert wastes,
(2) they found no way to a city where they might dwell.
(3) They were hungry and thirsty;
(4) their spirits languished within them. **R.**

(1) Then they cried out to you in their trouble,
(2) and you delivered them from their distress.
(3) You put their feet on a straight path
(4) to go to a city where they might dwell. **R.**

(1) You, O God, changed rivers into deserts,
(2) and water-springs into thirsty ground,
(3) A fruitful land into salt flats,
(4) because of the wickedness of those who dwell there. **R.**

(1) You changed deserts into pool of waters
(2) and dry lands into water-springs.
(1) You settled the hungry there,
(2) and they founded a city to dwell in.
(3) They sowed fields, and planted vineyards,
(4) and brought in a fruitful harvest. **R.**
