Responsorial Psalm 96:1-9(10-13)

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Sing to our God a new song;
- (2) sing to God, all the whole <u>earth</u>.
- (3) Bless the Name of God in <u>song;</u>
- (4) proclaim the good news of salvation from day to day. R.
- (1) Sing glory among the <u>nations</u>,
- (2) God's wonders among all peoples.
- (3) God is great and greatly to be praised;
- (4) more to be feared than all gods. **R.**
- (1) As for all the god's of the nations, they are but idols;
- (2) but it is the Holy One who made the heavens.
- (3) How majestic and splendid is <u>God</u>!
- (4) How wonderful God's holy temple! R.
- (1) Ascribe to our God, you families of the peoples;
- (2) ascribe to our God honour and power.
- (1) To the Holy Name ascribe due honour;
- (2) enter the hallowed courts with gifts.
- (3) Worship God in the beauty of <u>holiness;</u>
- (4) Let the earth tremble in awe and wonder. R.

- (1) Tell it out among the <u>nations</u>:
- (2) "Our God reigns, who made the world so firm that it cannot be moved, who judges the people with <u>equity</u>."
- (3) Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad;
- (4) let the sea thunder and all that is in it;let the field be joyful and all that is <u>therein</u>. **R**.
- (1) Then shall all the trees of the wood shout for joy at the coming of our <u>God</u>,
- (2) who will come to judge the <u>earth</u>.
- (3) God will judge the world with <u>righteousness</u>
- (4) and with truth the peoples of the <u>earth</u>. **R.**
