Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain George Black after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable. The style of performance should be cheerful and energetic, not mournful.

- (2) your wonders and the judgements of your mouth,
- (3) O offspring of Abraham yöur servant,
- (4) O children of Jacob your chosen. R.
- (1) You let out your people with silver and gold;
- (2) in all their tribes there was not one that stumbled.
- (3) Egypt was glad of their going,
- (4) because you were afraid of them. R.

- (1) You spread out a cloud for a covering
- (2) and a fire to give light in the night season.
- (3) They asked, and quails appeared,
- (4) and you satisfied them with bread from heaven R.
- (1) You opened the rock, and water flowed,
- (2) so the river ran in the dry places.
- (3) For you, O God, remembered your holy word
- (4) and Abraham your servant. R.
- (1) So you led forth your people with gladness,
- (2) your chosen people with shouts of joy.
- (1) You gave your people the lands of the <u>nations</u>,
- (2) and they took the fruit of others' toil,
- (3) That they might keep your statutes and observe your laws.
