




- 1-13

 - a vow to the Mighty One of Jacob:
- (1) "I will not come under the roof of my house,
- (2) nor climb up <u>in</u>to my bed;
- (3) I will not allow my eyes to sleep,
- (3) nor let my ele<u>lids</u> slumber;
- (4) Until I find you a resting place, a dwelling for the Mighty One <u>of</u> Jacob." R.
- (1) "The ark! We heard it was in Ephratah;
- (2) we found it in the fields of Jearim
- (3) Let us go to your dwelling <u>place</u>, O God;
