Introduction

- (1) Give ear to my words, O God;
- (2) consider my meditation.
- (3) Harken to my cry for help, O God whom I serve,
- (4) for I make my prayer to you. **R.**

- (1) In the morning, God, you hear my voice;
- (2) early in the morning I make my appeal and watch for you.
- (3) For you are not a God who take pleasure in wickedness,
- (4) and evil cannot dwell with you. **R.**

- (1) Braggarts cannot stand in your sight;
- (2) you hate all those who work wickedness.
- (3) You destroy those who speak lies;
- (4) the bloodthirsty and deceitful, O God, you abhor. **R.**

- (1) But as for me, through the greatness of your mercy I will go into you house;
- (2) I will bow down toward your holy temple in awe of you.
- (3) Lead me, O God, in your righteousness, because of those who lie in wait for me;
- (4) make your way straight before me. **R.**
