Psalm 9.9-20

After 1 Samuel 17:(1a 4-11, 19-23) 32-49

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) You will be a refuge to the oppressed, a refuge in time of trouble.
- (2) Those who know your name will put their trust in you, for you never forsake those who seek you, <u>O</u> God.
- (3) Sing praise to the Holy One who dwells in Zion; proclaim to the peoples the things God <u>has</u> done.
- (4) The avenger of blood will remember them; and will not forget the cry of the <u>afflicted</u>. **R.**
- (1) Have pity on me, O God; see the misery I suffer from those who hate me,
- (2) lift me up from the gate of death;
- (3) So that I may tell of all your praises and rejoice in your salvation
- (4) in the gates of the $\overline{\text{city of Zion.}}$ **R.**

- (1) The ungodly have fallen into the pit they dug, and in the snare they set is their own foot <u>caught</u>.
- (2) You are known, O God, by your acts of justice; the wicked are trapped in the works of their <u>own</u> hands.
- (3) The wicked shall be given over to the grave, and also all the peoples that forget God.
- (4) For the needy shall not always be forgotten, and the hope of the poor shall not perish <u>for</u> ever. **R.**
- (1) Rise up, O God, let not the ungodly have the upper hand;
- (2) let them be judged <u>be</u>fore you.
- (3) Put fear upon them, O God;
- (4) let the ungodly know they are \underline{but} mortal. \mathbf{R} .
