(4) shine forth, you that are enthroned up<u>on</u> the cherubin.

- (5) In the presence of Ephrain, Benjamin, Manasseh,
- (6) stir up your strength and <u>come</u> to help us. **R.**
- (1) You have brought a vine out <u>of</u> Egypt;
- (2) you cast out the nations and planted it.
- (3) You prepared the ground for it;
- (4) it took root and <u>filled</u> the land.
- (5) The mountains were covered \underline{by} its shadow
- (6) and the towering cedar trees \underline{by} its boughs. **R.**
- (1) You stretched out its tendrils to the Sea
- (2) and its branches to the River.
- (3) Why have you broken down its wall,
- (4) so that all who pass by <u>pluck</u> off its grapes?
- (5) The wild boar of the forest has <u>ravaged</u> it,
- (6) and the beasts of the field have grazed upon it.

- (1) Turn now, O God <u>of</u> hosts,
- (2) look down from heaven;
- (3) behold and <u>tend</u> this vine;
- (4) preserve what your right <u>hand</u> has planted.
- (5) They burn it with <u>fire</u> like rubbish;
- (6) at the rebuke of your countenance let them perish. R.
- (1) Let your hand be upon your chosen people,
- (2) those you have made so strong for <u>your</u>self.
- (3) And so will we never turn away from you;
- (4) give us life, that we may call up<u>on</u> your name.
- (5) Restore us, O God of hosts;
- (6) show the light of your countenance, and we <u>shall</u> be saved. **R.**
