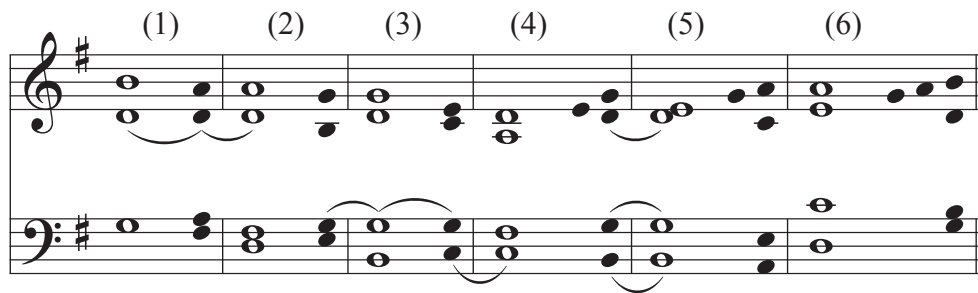


Psalm 66.1-11

Introduction



- (1) Be joyful in God, all you lands;
- (2) sing the glory of God's name;
sing the glory of God's praise.
- (3) Say to God, "How awesome are your deeds!"
- (4) because of your great strength
your enemies cringe before you.
- (5) All the earth bows down before you,
- (6) sings to you, sings out your name." **R.**

- (1) We will come and see your works, O God,
- (2) how wonderful you are toward all people.
- (3) You turned the sea into dry land,
so that they went through the water on foot,
- (4) In your might you rule for ever;
- (5) your eyes keep watch over the nations;
- (6) let no rebel rise up against you. **R.**

- (1) Let all peoples bless you, O God;
- (2) make the voice of your praise resound.
- (3) You hold our souls in life,
- (4) and will not allow our feet to slip. **R.**

- (1) For you, O God, have proved us;
- (2) you have tried us just as silver is tried.
- (3) You have brought us into the snare;
- (4) you laid heavy burdens upon our backs.
- (5) You let enemies ride over our heads,
we went through fire and water!
- (6) but you brought us out into a place of refreshment. **R.**
