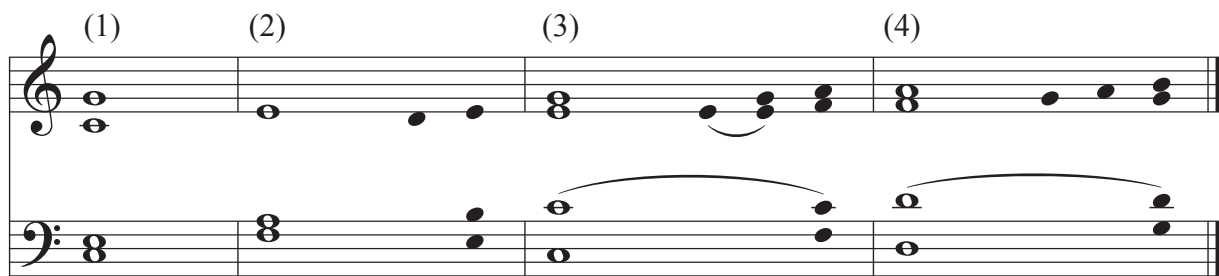
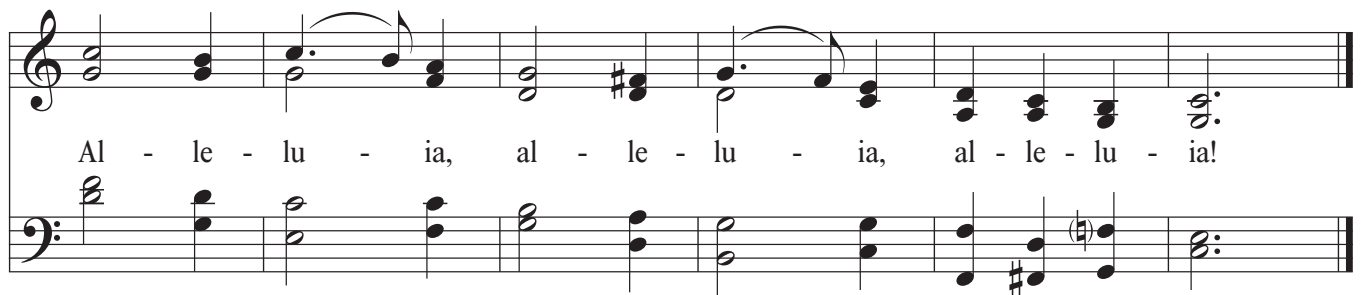


# Christ Our Passover (Vulpius)

I Cor. 6.7-8, Rom. 6.9-11, I Cor. 15.20-22

*A cantor sings the Alleluias. All repeat them. A cantor or choir sings the verses.  
All repeat the Alleluias after each stanza.*

- (1) Christ our passover has been sacrificed for us;
- (2) therefore let us keep the feast
- (3) not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil,
- (4) but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

**R.** Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

- (1) Christ being raised from the dead will never die again;
- (2) death no longer has dominion over him.
- (1) The death that he died, he died to sin, once and for all;
- (2) but the life he lives, he lives to God.
- (3) So also consider yourselves dead to sin,
- (4) and alive to God in Jesus Christ our Lord.

**R.** Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

- (1) Christ has been raised from the dead,
- (2) the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.
- (1) for since by a man came death,
- (2) by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead.
- (3) For as in Adam all die,
- (4) so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

**R.** Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia
