Psalm 32

Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable.



- (1) Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven, and whose sine is put away!
- (2) Happy are they to whom God imputes no guilt, and in whose spirit there is no guile!
- (3) While I held my tongue, my bones withered away, because of my groaning all <u>day</u> long.
- (4) For your hand was heavy upon me day and night; my moisture was dried up as in the $\underline{\text{heat}}$ of summer. R.
- (1) Then I acknowledged my sin to you, and did not conceal my guilt.
- (2) I said, "I will confess my transgressions to God." Then you forgave me the guilt of my sin.
- (3) Therefore all the faithful will make their prayers to you in time \underline{of} trouble;
- (4) when the great waters overflow, they shall not reach them. \mathbf{R} .
- (1) You are my hiding place; you preserve me from trouble;
- (1) You surround me with shouts of deliverence.
- (2) "I will instruct you and teach you in the way that you should go; I will guide you with my eye.
- (3) Do not be like horse or mule, which have no understanding;
- (4) who must be fitted with bit and bridle, or else they will \underline{not} stay near you." R.
- (1) Great are the tribulations of the wicked;
- (2) but mercy embraces those who trust \underline{in} God.
- (3) Be glad, you righteous, and rejoice in God;
- (4) shout for joy, all who are $\underline{\text{true}}$ of heart. R.
