Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable. Two cantors may be used. If there is only one cantor, it is possible to use only line 1-4 or 5-8 of the psalm-tone.



- (1) Sing to our God a <u>new</u> song;
- (2) Sing to God, all the whole earth.
- (3) Bless the name of God in song;
- (4) proclaim the good news of salvation from <u>day</u> to day. **R.**
- (5) Sing glory among the nations,
- (6) God's wonders among all peoples.

- (8) more to be feared than all gods. R.
- (1) As for all the gods of the nations, they are but idols;
- (2) but it is the Holy One who made the heavens.
- (3) How majestic and splendid is God!
- (4) How wonderful God's holy temple! R.
- (5) Ascribe to our God, you families of the peoples;
- (6) ascribe to our God honour and power.
- (7) To the Holy Name ascribe <u>due</u> honour;
- (8) enter the hallowed courts with gifts. R.

- (5) Worship God in the beauty of holiness;
- (6) Let the earth tremble in awe and wonder.
- (1) Tell it out among the nations: "Our God reigns,
- (1) who made the world so firm that it cannot be moved,
- (2) who judges the peoples with equity"
- (3) Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad;
- (3) let the sea thunder and all that is in it;
- (4) let the field be joyful and all that is therein. R.
- (5) Then shall all thre trees of the wood shout for joy at the coming of <u>our</u> God,
- (6) who will come to judge the earth.
- (7) God will judge the world with righteousness
- (6) and with truth the peoples of the earth. R.
