Introduction. Cantor sings refrain. All repeat refrain. Cantor sings verses. All sing refrain after each group of verses. In the psalm-tone the singer leaves the reciting note on the underlined word or syllable. Two cantors may be used. If there is only one cantor, it is possible to use only line 1-4 or 5-8 of the psalm-tone.

- (8) and deliver them from the hand of the wicked. R.
- (1) Light has sprung up for the righteous,
- (2) and joyful gladness for those who are <u>true</u>hearted.
- (3) Let the righteous rejoice <u>in</u> your,
- (4) and give thanks to your holy name. R.
